415-431, Vol. 4 (II)	Various students of the University gave their feedback favoring the introduction of semester system at undergraduate level.
15.11.2010 457-470, Vol. 4 (II)	This Hon'ble Court in W.P.(C) No. 7248/2010 titled Prof. M.R. Gupta v. University of Delhi & Ors. after emphasizing upon the importance of education and imparting of knowledge by the teachers and highlighting the various judicial precedents in India and abroad holding strikes as illegal and unlawful directed the teachers to cooperate in teaching as per the semester system or else their non-cooperation would be treated as absenteeism and adequate steps would be taken in regard thereto by the concerned authorities. This Court took note of the fact that some of the Professors and teachers had gone on strike to cripple the education system.
08.02.2011	This Hon'ble Court vide its order in the instant matter was pleased to direct the teachers of the Delhi University to teach in the semester mode without taking recourse to strike or any other mode. This court noted that they had already stated in their earlier decisions that strikes were impermissible modes.
16.03.2011	This Hon'ble Court in W.P.(C) No. 1722/2011 titled Ramit Garg v. University of Delhi & Ors. vide its interim order prohibited the teachers of the University from going on strike and directed them to perform their statutory and legal duties with utmost sincerity, failing which they would be liable to contempt of Court.
25.04.2011 61-78, C.A. in W.P.(C)No. 2764/2011	The Academic Council of the University held its special meeting in which the following important decisions/resolutions were passed: (a) The semester based syllabi of 53 undergraduate courses were approved. (b) The actions taken by the then Vice-Chancellor in exercising emergency powers for implementing 13 undergraduate science courses in the academic session 2010-2011 were ratified. (c) The Academic Council authorized the Vice-Chancellor to take all the necessary measures as he may deem fit (including bifurcation of the syllabi, if required) for their implementation from the academic session 2011-2012 for those undergraduate courses of study in respect of which the revised syllabi had not been received from the concerned faculties. Note: (i) Total membership: 134, (ii) Members present: 101, (iii) Dissent: 6, (iv) In favour: 95
25.04.2011 79-82, C.A. in W.P.(C)No. 2764/2011	The Executive Council of the University held its special meeting in which the following important decisions/resolutions were passed: (a) The recommendation of the Academic Council made in its special meeting held on 25.04.2011 proposing replacement of syllabi as per the annual mode of various courses of study with revised semester based

(Note: One member dissented)</p> <p>(b) The actions taken by the then Vice-Chancellor in exercise of his emergency powers under Statute 11(G)(4) of the University in approving the recommendations of the Committee with regard to amendments in various Ordinances relating to implementation of the semester scheme w.e.f. the academic session 2010-2011 was reported, recorded and confirmed. (Note: Two members dissented)</p> <p>(c) The resolution of the Academic Council authorizing the Vice-Chancellor to take all the necessary measures with respect to semesterisation of syllabi (including bifurcation of the syllabi, if required) with respect to courses that had not been received by the faculties was approved. 28.04.2011	This Hon'ble Court vide its common order in W.P. (C) No. 822/2011 and W.P. (C) No. 2764/2011 expressed its hope and trust that the teachers of the University would not disrupt the teaching schedules or harbor the notion of 'peaceful protest' by teaching outside the classrooms or in tents as the interest of the students and the institution was paramount.
10.05.2011 134-136, W.P.(C) No. 2764/2011	The Ministry of Human Resources Development (Respondent No. 4 in W.P.(C) No. 2764/2011) filed a Counter-Affidavit stating that the Academic Council did not violate/contravene any of the provisions of the Act, Statute, Regulations, etc. in conducting its business. Further, the MHRD deposed in support of the academic and administrative reforms with change to the semester system being one of the essential features.
16.05.2011	This Hon'ble Court was pleased to pass a common interim order in W.P. (C) No. 822/2011 and W.P. (C) No. 2764/2011 vide which this Hon'ble Court stated that which system was in the interest of the students was not a facet to be gone into by them as they were not an expert in that regard and that the academic matters were to be decided by the competent authorities of the University after following due procedure of law. This Hon'ble Court very categorically directed the teachers of the University and of all its constituent colleges to co-operate in all aspects and teach in the semester mode and not to proceed on the path of deviation as the same would bring them in the net of violators of the Court.
30.05.2011	Being aggrieved by the common interim order dated 16.05.2011, an SLP(C) No. 15553-54/2011 was filed by Nandini Dutta & Ors. before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which was dismissed as withdrawn.
25.4.2011	AC and EC meetings held and the AC proposed draft amendment to Ordinance (App-II to Ord. V). AC Meeting: Present 101, Dissent-6, Support 95 EC Meeting: Present 16, Dissent -2, Support 14
08.07.2011	A regular meeting of the Academic Council of the University was held in which the syllabus of all the undergraduate courses as per the semester system was approved for the ensuing

	academic year 2011-2012. Draft amendment to Appendix II to Ordinance V of the Ordinances regarding the courses of study was also recommended. Out of 88 members present in the meeting no one dissented on the items relating to draft amendment to App-II to Ord. V to Ordinances proposed by the AC.
09.07.2011	The Executive Council of the University approved the said amendments proposed by the Academic Council. Out of 17 members present in the meeting, 2 members dissented on the item relating to approval of the draft amendment to Ordinance proposed by the AC.
20.7.2011	The Registrar of the University vide Notification No. F.5/4/230/2011/Council-II notified the amendments made to Ordinances and Appendices to Ordinances of the University that were passed by the Executive Council of the University at its meetings held on 25.4.2011 and 9.7.2011.
24.08.2011	A University Court meeting was held as per requirement of Section 31(4) of the Delhi University Act, 1922 and the newly amended Ordinance and appendices were placed before the University Court. The Court meeting was attended by 251 Members. The said Resolution was passed by the Court. Seven (7) members dissented on Agenda Item no. 5(a).
05.09.2011	After passing of the said resolution the University has now forwarded the newly amended Ordinances for the information of the Visitor through Ministry of HRD and also for laying before each House of Parliament as per Section 32 (5) of the Delhi University Act, 1922. University has also written a letter to Government of India, Department of Publication for publication of amendments to Ordinance in the Gazette of India, Part-III Section-4
07.09.2011	A reply to the letter dated 05.09.2011 received from the publishing Department for sending authorization of MHRD
27.09.2011 & 15.11.2011	Letters addressed to Ministry of Human Resource Development seeking authorization for publishing of amendments to the official Gazette of India
